#### Relevance

Micronesia boasts a youthful population, with a median age of 21.5 years and over 34% falling within the 15-34 age bracket. This presents a unique opportunity for national development. However, it also strains resources and highlights the need to address young people's challenges. These challenges include limited education and employment prospects, societal changes impacting families, and negative influences like easy access to drugs and alcohol. The Youth and Family Issues in the Communities program addresses these pressing issues, paving the way for a brighter future for Micronesia's youth.

#### **Extension's Response**

The youth extension program implemented various activities across FSM counties, including outreach initiatives, educational workshops, and practical training sessions. Collaborating with local stakeholders and utilizing traditional meeting halls, the program delivers workshops on craft-making, sewing, music, sports, and vocational training tailored to the needs of each community. The program ensured maximum participation and engagement among youth and families by fostering partnerships and employing flexible scheduling.
